### PERMIT CONDITIONS

This permit is issued to Robert Terbush and Melanic McCarthy under the authority of the Federal Plant Pest Act for the attached 2 page list of 41 butterfly and moth species to be received and reared at 51 Beebe Road, Wilbraham, MA.

PLEASE NOTE that eleven species have been removed from the original list requested because of the potential to establish in the environment if they were to escape. If you have further questions please contact: Wayne Wehling, USDA APHIS PPQ, 301 734-8757

None of the specimens that are originally obtained from sources outside of Massachusetts or that do not naturally occur in Massachusetts can be reared outside of the main butterfly house facility (e.g. sleeves on foliage).

No Release to the environment is permitted under this permit.

Permission is granted to receive butterflies and moths from any source in the United States provided that the genetic stock is of U.S. Origin with the one exception that monarchs must be from populations east of the Continental divide.

Any further distribution of these species must be covered by a permit issued to the person(s) receiving any shipments.

This permit does not relieve the applicant of the responsibility for complying with other Federal or State requirements (e.g., Environmental Protection Agency, U.S. Fish and Wildlife [Form 3-177], etc.).

#### Conditions:

1. Insects are to be shipped in sturdy escape -proof containers
2. No insect host material is to be included in the shipments.
3. The permittee is to ensure that shipments are not contaminated with any plant pests, or AQI-risk-associated plant materials.
4. Plant Protection and Quarantine Officers may inspect any part of the premises where the pests are contained, during normal business hours, with no prior notice being necessary.
